In 2023, we delivered 100,000 meals to our neighbors in need. This is, by far, the most meals we have delivered in a year, since 1969! We are excited to continue evolving our services to better meet the needs of our community.

Where many Meals on Wheels programs are struggling to recruit and train volunteers, our volunteers provide more than 85 hours EVERY DAY to help provide meals to our Boulder neighbors. Whether it is delivering meals, making friendly check-in calls, or helping in the kitchen, the Café, the Niche Market, and our offices, our volunteers are the heart and soul of our organization. Meal Delivery

Volunteers deliver nutritionally-balanced meals to Meals on Wheels of Boulder clients five days a week, with frozen options for the weekends. Every meal is made daily by professional chefs and can be customized to fit any dietary restrictions. These healthy and delicious meals are accompanied by a wellbeing check-in by our friendly and caring volunteers.





Project Homecoming

A program available for people (regardless of age or income) who have been discharged from the hospital due to surgery, illness, having a baby, or are receiving long term treatment or rehabilitation from surgery. We provide five free meals, no strings attached, upon their transition from hospital to home. Meals on Wheels of Boulder volunteers deliver these nutritionally-balanced meals to their doors, so the patient can prioritize recovery. Like all of our meals, these dishes are made daily by professional chefs and can be customized to fit any dietary restrictions. If more meals are needed, there is an option to sign up for regular meal delivery.

The Niche Market

This neighborhood, corner market is located in the Meals on Wheels of Boulder building. We sell convenience items, local brand favorites, nutritious grocery essentials, as well as our Think Goodness Foods products. Open to the public Monday - Friday, 9 am - 6 pm. Closed Saturday and Sunday.

The Eat Well Café

Located on 909 Arapahoe in the West Age Well Center, this restaurant quality café serves lunch Monday - Friday from 11 am - 1 pm. Home of the \$7.99 meal: a choice of two entrees per day, a side salad or cup of soup, and dessert and beverage. Sandwiches, paninis, wraps, salads, and more are available each day.

Making an Impact, Improving Lives

In August 2023, she signed up for Project Homecoming since her arm was broken. She was 59 and living alone. During this time, her life was coming apart. She had financial challenges, and she was socially isolated. She used to play music to lift her spirits being a musician from Puerto Rico, but her instruments are now silent. Her doctor noted she was underweight due to malnutrition. Without being able to feed herself properly or have the social connections needed for help, she decided to stay with Meals on Wheels of Boulder. She gets hot, nutritious meals delivered Monday through Friday and looks forward to her visits with her friendly volunteer driver. Despite all the hardships, this year her doctor noted that her overall well-being was better, and she is now at a normal weight. Her challenges continue since she currently needs three hand surgeries, but she knows she has Meals on Wheels of Boulder to help see her

She was a teacher and gave to her community every day through her job. In 2008, her husband fell ill, and they needed meals delivered to their home. In 2017, she decided to also become a client since the time she spent as his caregiver made it challenging to prepare and cook meals for herself. In 2018, her husband passed away. She continued having meals delivered to get her through this difficult life transition. Not soon after, she found out she had Macular Degeneration. She is now legally blind and depends on Meals on Wheels of Boulder now more than ever before. She enjoys knowing her volunteer delivery drivers by name and the ability to converse with them personally. She is not alone. She says she can count on the meals and the dependability of her meals being delivered, which gives her peace of mind. Through it all, she has remained a positive light. In 2023, she asked her church to fundraise for Meals on Wheels of Boulder. Despite all she has been through, she is still giving back to her community in appreciation for how Meals on Wheels of Boulder has cared for her and her husband through the years.




